Scarborough Fair, played once through as shown in the notation (ie without all the verse repeats). The intro goes straight into a single verse, then straight to the outro. On the original there are five verses, but we figured you'd be all waltzed-out if we included them here!

The guitar used was a Takamine EN10C DI-d straight into a Roland VS880 hard disk recorder. Reverb and a little compression were added at mixdown stage

Guitar: Kit Morgan

This classic 1960s Simon & Garfunkel hit is heavily vocalbased, but KIT MORGAN probes beyond the tonsils to reveal a well-honed acoustic guitar part.

HE original Scarborough Fair/Canticle was first released back in 1966 on the (equally-succinctly titled) album, Parsley, Sage, Rosemary and Thyme, along with other hits Homeward Bound and The 59th Street Bridge Song (Feelin' Groovy). The guitar part remains the same throughout all of the verses except for some very subtle differences which were probably mistakes in the first place!

Because TG capo notation shows the capo as if it was an open string, you should be able to play this with or without a capo. On this occasion, I'd recommend using one if you can, simply because without a 7th fret capo the 'tinklyness' doesn't come across as much. The most important aspect to get right is the picking pattern, which breaks down the beats into quavers for the most part. If you're unused to playing waltz time this one's a good exercise to improve your fingerstyle. The basic pattern is used right from bar 1 of the intro,

and the strings are picked in the order fifth, first, third, fourth, second third - the thumb plays the fifth and fourth strings, and the fingers cover the rest. This pattern is maintained, apart from bar 16 where there's a double-hammer-on figure which is made awkward by the plucked note on the third string. If this feels really wierd, just stick to the hammer-ons - I think you'll get away with it! IG
